**Comments:**

***PowerPoint***

- Add menopause, stress and depression to risk factors.
- Add instructions to notes to indicate when to pause for survey completion.
- Mention CPR certification as a lifestyle change to make.

***Handout & Magnet***

- Symptom list incomplete, especially for women.
- Handout may be too busy and difficult for some populations to read. Simplify text; focus more on the signs of heart attack and increase their font size.

***FAQ Sheet for Presenters***

- Add question about the cost of calling 9-1-1.
- Account for unstable/changing angina pattern.
- Clarify instructions for taking nitroglycerin.
- Correct aspirin dosing and use “low-dose (previously called baby or children’s)”.

***Other***

- Some communities have similar programs already in place.
- Clear IRB need for some hospitals.
- Provide an incentive for the follow-up survey.
- Pilot timeline is very tight.
